Student Responsibility:

As a student in the College of Engineering it is your responsibility to know and complete satisfactorily all degree requirements within the allotted time frame. Advisers are available to guide you through the various requirements of the College of Engineering curriculum, but it is your responsibility to ensure that you fulfill them. If at any point you don't understand a particular requirement, or have any questions about your progress toward your degree, see your Student Affairs Adviser in 308 McLaughlin Hall.

This sheet provides a convenient way to track completion of requirements, but it is an unofficial assessment of your degree progress. You must meet with your Student Affairs Adviser in 308 McLaughlin for an official graduation review no later than fall semester of your senior year.

Instructions:

Use your transcript and/or online degree audit report (DAR) to complete this worksheet. Your DAR can be accessed via Bear Facts. <Academic Record. Degree Audit Report. Audits. Request New Audit >

For requirements you have fulfilled, record the semester it was completed, units earned and the grade received. If you used an exam (AP, IB or A Level) record the name of the test, your score and units earned.

In instances where you have a choice (electives), list the actual course you completed.

DO include courses you have in progress this semester. DO NOT include courses you plan to take in the future on the worksheet you bring to your faculty adviser. Faculty need to see what you have actually completed to make recommendations on what you should take next semester.

Humanities and Social Science Requirement:

1. A minimum of six courses (3 units or more) from the Humanities/Social Science list.
2. At least two of the six courses must be upper division (100-196).
3. At least two courses must be from the same department and at least one of the two must be upper division. (Series)
4. No more than two of the six courses may be satisfied by tests (AP, IB or A Level)
5. AP tests can be combined with a course to complete the series requirement. For example, AP History (any) combined with an upper division History course would satisfy the series requirement.
5. Two of the six must satisfy the College of Engineering's reading and composition requirement. Once enrolled, the reading and composition requirement must be completed at UC Berkeley.
6. One course must satisfy the University's American Cultures requirement.
7. Courses taken to satisfy the reading and composition requirement must be taken for a letter grade. All other courses used to satisfy the Humanities/Social Science requirement may be taken P/NP.
8. Courses used to complete the upper division and/or series requirement may count toward multiple categories. For example, if you complete City and Regional Planning 115 and 118AC that would satisfy the series requirement, the two upper division courses requirement, and the American Cultures requirement.
